We offer members many areas of patriotic and historical service.

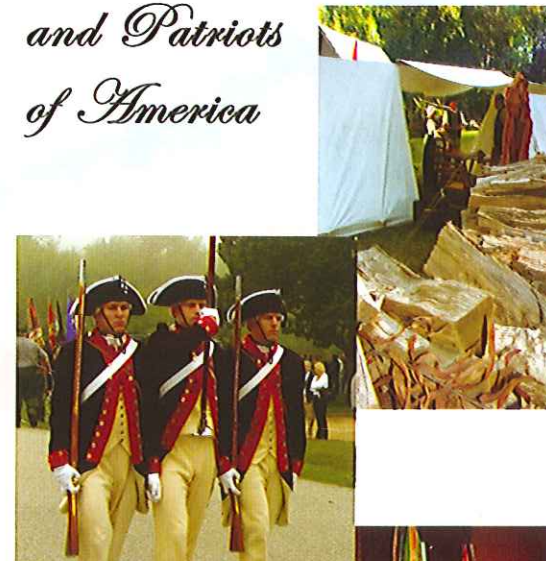

The Society's Restoration Project receives contributions towards the preservation of records in the original 13 Colonies. We award funds to deserving library, archival, historical, or genealogical projects with all yearly distributions approved by the NSDFPA National Executive Board.

Mason with these objectives: to associate with congenial women whose ancestors struggled together in the country's founding and sustained the Colonies in the struggle for independence; to teach reverent regard for those founders, while encouraging patriotism and commemorating events in the history of the colonists; to work for the preservation of historic and family records, and to obtain and provide supplies to Army and Navy hospitals during times of war. Over 100 years later, the work of the society is vital to America's future.
